FROM PASTOR COLE...

Jesus gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day..." (Matthew 28:18-20, The Message)

This past Sunday we entered into the longest season of the church calendar: "Ordinary Time." The picture to the side is a good way of thinking about the church year (although, I'm unsure of who to credit for creating the picture).

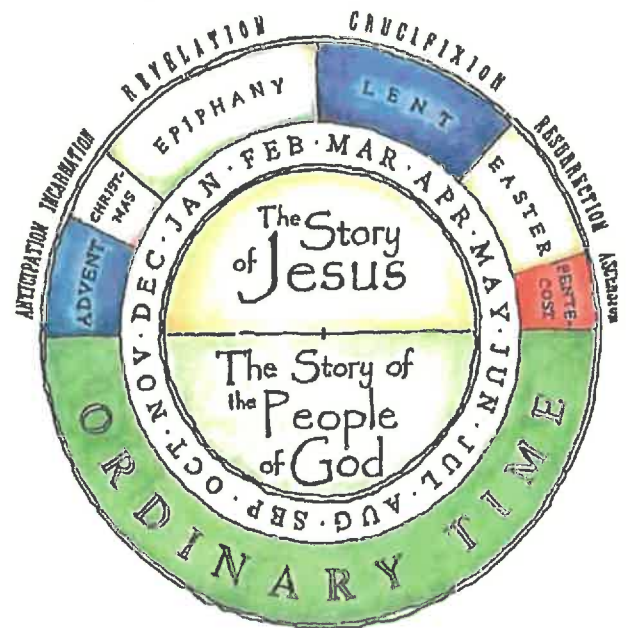
The church season we are entering now is about God's work through us. It is how "our story" connects with "THE Story." This is the longest season of the church I think in part because while Jesus' story is absolutely critical, it was just the beginning of The Story. You and I are co-authors with God as we continue the work God began in Jesus.

So, what does that mean for us? I mean really? What does it mean that what God started in and through Jesus was just the beginning? Why does that matter for our lives today?

As Walter Brueggemann puts it: it's a "Task and a Privilege." On the one hand, the fact that we are a part of God's unfolding story is a task. We have work to do. God has chosen to work through people like you and me. Jesus' final words quoted above tell us to "train everyone you meet... in this way of life." The way of life he seemed to be referring to was drenched in grace, healing, teaching, loving and bringing people into God's family.

That is a task indeed, but it is also a privilege. We have been called for exactly "such a time as this" (Esther 4:13). I know the world we live in feels upside down and full of "never before." But that doesn't surprise God. And God is still choosing you, choosing me, to continue writing The Story — the story of love, redemption, hope, peace, joy and more.

This long season of the church is part of our task, our privilege. Some days it may feel more like a task. I hope in other days we can soak up the great privilege it is. But never doubt for one



moment that in this season — as in every season — God’s promise to always be with us remains. We can never be separated from the love of God (Romans 8:38-39).

I am praying with you and for you. We have been called and equipped for this season and I can’t wait to see what God is going to continue doing through us all.

Each month we will begin highlighting something you can do, read or be part of to help care for God's creation. We believe that God has created an unbelievable world and we also believe that WE have been given stewardship of that creation. That means we need to love, tend to and care for creation in every way we can.

This month, you are invited to join us for a movie night about the state of the planet. On **June 7th at 5:30pm in the Fellowship Hall**, all are invited to join us for a movie (popcorn will be provided) and a short time of discussion afterwards. We hope to see you there!

P.S. If you can't join us for this movie night, we highly encourage you to check out "Our Great National Parks" on Netflix. There are 5 episodes in this short but powerful series. You will be blown away by the beauty of this world!

AN INVITATION FROM THE GRACE BIBLE STUDY CLASS...

Meets on Fridays, at 9:30AM to around 11:00AM

We've started a seven-week study of Hebrews on Friday, but there's still time to attend. Though it won't cover all the book, a broad overview is given in the following paragraphs, introducing the book. Secondly, a two-page handout is available when you exist the Sanctuary. This provides a larger context into what the writer of Hebrews was inspired to write (2 Timothy 3:16).

A growing number believe Hebrews was written by an unknown preacher and it's laid out like a three-point sermon. After a brief prologue, which defines the nature of Christ—and precisely defines His relationship with His Father (Heb 1:1-4), it is a call to believers for a total commitment to Christ. Perhaps what's most practical is that it brings the unique unsurpassed message of hope to a Church that is "worn out and worn down." It could not be more relevant, in my judgment, for many churches today.

First, this sermon presents Christ, who is superior over all things. As one does their best to "keep their eyes upon Jesus" as an old short chorus put it, while following the teachings of *The Holy Bible*, it reminds me of others, who are "drifting too far from the shore" as an old Gospel hymn puts it (1:5-4:13).

Second, it presents Christ as our superior High Priest (4:14-10:18), asserting Christ was not only fully God, but fully human: "We do not have a High Priest, who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are, yet without sin (Heb 4:14-15), 'a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief... one who can identify with our struggles...'" (Is 53:3-4). Most interestingly, this entire prophecy typifies His suffering, death, and resurrection, in *The Old Testament* and *The New Testament* (Isaiah 52:13-53:12). For Jesus asserts, "I did not come to abolish the Law and the Prophets [that is, the whole of the Old Testament], but I came to fulfill them" (Matthew 5:17).

Third, the last section (10:19-13-25) elaborates on what has been studied, specifying in practical detail what's important in our spiritual formation, emphasizing our responsibilities in caring for those to whom God has entrusted to us, that is, the necessity of uniting one's faith in Christ to Christian living.

The class, once again, meets in the Fellowship Hall, but I always summarize the previous week for those who couldn't attend. Curriculum and/or illustrative materials are available to prepare for each week and can be secured by contacting us at 926-3135. If we are unavailable, please do leave a message. In Christ, Rev. BECOMING ROOTED: 100 DAYS OF RECONNECTING WITH SACRED EARTH...

Pastor Cole invites you to join him in 100 days of rooting ourselves to God's Sacred Creation. It is so easy to connect with the beauty of the mountains that surround us. However, we are often too busy to really pause and consider our place, our role, in creation.

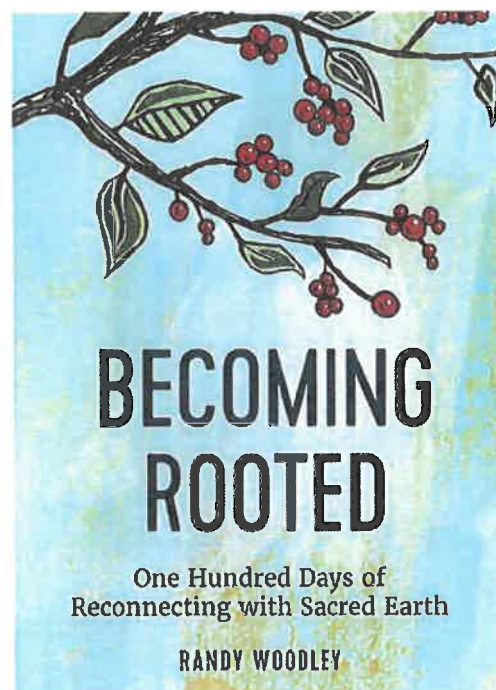
Join Pastor Cole in reading Randy Woodley's book, *Becoming Rooted: One Hundred Days of Reconnecting with Sacred Earth*. You will read the short reflection each day and then we will join together June 28, July 19, and August 16th at 10am in the Fellowship Hall. During the group gathering, you will be invited to share your reflections, questions, pictures and anything else that may be relevant.

If you would like to participate in the book club and didn't preorder a book, you can purchase a copy on Amazon.

Here is a short description of the book:

What does it mean to become rooted in the land? How can we become better relatives to our greatest teacher, the Earth? Becoming Rooted invites us to live out a deeply spiritual relationship with the whole community of creation and with Creator.

Through meditations and ideas for reflection and action, Randy Woodley, an activist, author, scholar, and Cherokee descendant, recognized by the Keetoowah Band, guides us on a one-hundred-day journey to reconnect with the Earth. Woodley invites us to come away from the American dream--otherwise known as an Indigenous nightmare--and get in touch with the water, land, plants, and creatures around us, with the people who lived on that land for thousands of years prior to Europeans' arrival, and with ourselves. In walking toward the harmony way, we honor balance, wholeness, and connection. Creation is always teaching us. Our task is to look, and to listen, and to live well. She is teaching us now.



TELL ME A STORY WEDNESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY...
